Discussion Questions

Read John 1:29-51. This account is of Jesus first meeting with Peter, James, John, Philip, Andrew and Nathaniel. John tells the back-story of how these men first met Jesus. How does this meeting along with Luke 4 set the scene for the call of Jesus’ first disciples?

Imagine yourself as one of those on the seashore when Jesus is teaching. What might that have been like?

How must Peter have felt when after a long night fishing and morning cleaning his net to have Jesus (a Rabbi) tell him to put out his net in the daytime?

How does Peter’s obedience to a command that does not make sense become the precursor to discipleship for him?

Imagine standing knee deep in fish in a boat about to take on water and looking at a shoreline full of people. How do these two scenes reflect one another? Read Matthew 9:36-38. Think again.

Think about this quote from John Ortberg. “When fishermen don’t fish, they fight!” How does this describe the body of Christ?
