**Discussion Questions**

Compare and contrast the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7) and the Sermon on the Plain (Luke 6). Why would modern scholars want to make the two into one? Why is it so hard to simply take the text at face value?

How is the teaching of Jesus in Luke 6:20-26 “new wine” and how are His disciples “new wineskins”?

How is poverty of spirit (i.e. the knowledge of being beggars at the gate) contrasted with the picture of us as children of God? Where do we stop being beggars and become children?

How hungry are you for deeper revelation and deeper relationship with God?

How does verse 21 tell us we should feel about our past life of sin and brokenness?

Do we look enough like Jesus to be persecuted in His name?
