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Discussion Questions**

Spend some time discussing how a loving God can strengthen an enemy to bring those He loves back home. Think about the parable of the prodigal son told by Jesus.

Has God ever disciplined you to bring you back to the path of righteousness and to His heart? Have you ever disciplined your own children this way?

Discuss the idea that with His left hand (judgment) God strengthens Eglon and with His right hand (blessing) raises up Ehud as a deliverer. (Isn't it comical that Ehud is left handed?)

How does God use a perceived weakness in Ehud (left handed) as strength in delivering Israel? How does God want to use your perceived weaknesses to bring deliverance to others?

We often see ourselves as the hero of our stories elevating men like David (goliath), Ehud, or even the Apostle Paul to heroic status. How is their story and ours really a story about God as our only hero?
