The Gospel According to Luke Satan Entered Into Judas Luke 22:1-13

Weekly Memory Verse: "And satan entered into Judas who was called Iscariot, belonging to the number of the twelve." Luke 22:3

Judas was a disciple of Jesus who had no marks against his discipleship (at least that we know). How can a crossroads moment like the taking of a small silver coin lead to such disastrous results?

Read I Cor 10:12-13. How did Jesus offer Judas an escape route even in the last moments?
