How do you see Haggai and Zechariah tag teaming the people as one speaks to the rebuilding of the Temple and the other to the rebuilding of the people? What are they preparing for?

How do you see God's anger as part of His love for us? Can we be angry with people we love?

Read Proverbs 6:16-19. What do the things that God "hates" have in common?
