The Gospel According to Luke The King Has Come Luke 19:28-44

Weekly Memory Verse: "I tell you if these stones become silent, the stones will cry out!" Luke 19:40b

Read Exodus 12:2-6. How do you see the plan of God in the Passover played out in the final week of Jesus in Jerusalem?

Jesus enters Jerusalem as a King humble and mounted on a donkey. This is the beginning of the Year of God's Favor. Read Rev 7:9-12 and Rev 19:11-16. How will the day close with many of the same pictures? How different are the pictures?

Go back and read Zechariah chapter 9-10. How do you see the prophet looking forward to Luke 19 and Rev 19 yet blending the pictures (remember the image of two mountain peaks that look like one from a distance)?

Read Malachi 3:1-7 and 4:1-6. How does Malachi blend the two peaks of Luke 19 and Rev 19?

When you think of the people missing who Jesus is in Luke 19, does it help if you read Romans 9:30-33? Realize that Israel counted itself righteous because of the "Law" and sacrifices. They did not need freedom from sin, they supposed they already had it.

In what ways do you think the Church today has missed the day of our visitation (The Favorable Year of the Lord)? Are we living as if we are in that day?
