Read Romans 1:18-25. How does this compare to what you see happening with Israel in Judges 10:6-14? How about what happens with Jephthah in 11:34-35?

Think about the idea that God "could bear the misery of Israel no longer". How does this compare to a parent who deals with a wayward child? How does the grace of God in the midst of our sin help you to understand the love of God. (Romans 5:8)

How is the call of Jephthah an example of how far Israel has fallen throughout the book? Look at the obvious comparison in language to Judges 1:1-2

How does the early life and insecurity of Jephthah form the basis for his downfall? (His desire to be a king and making the battle his own) How do our insecurities feed into our own sinful behavior?

Even when God "gives us over" to our own choices how do we see his grace ready to bring us home in 10:16?
